

# Nauvoo, Illinois

## A National Historic Landmark

*Nauvoo*, (Hebrew for Beautiful) was named such by Joseph Smith, founder of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter Day Saints. Joseph Smith and his followers settled on this swampy land located on the bend of the Mississippi River in 1839. They skillfully drained the water and cleared the land to make way for what would become one of the *largest cities* on the American Frontier.

Through the decades, Nauvoo's history was painted by colorful cultures that remain evident today through the architecture and the remnants of diverse cultures. The Icarian movement (a communal society) brought to Nauvoo, Illinois' Oldest Winery, Baxter's Vineyards, a 5th generation Icarian Family run winery. Travel the streets and experience the Icarian, German and early settlers of yesterday whose brush strokes paint the picture of Nauvoo today.

Today, more than 60 restored historic sites and 5 visitor's centers come together to tell the story and bring the past to life. Tour the historic sites, hear the stories and see Beautiful Nauvoo through the stories told.
