

Nauvoo City Council News October 10, 2017

- Approved 1st Reading of 2017-10, an Ordinance approving change in zoning and changing the zoning district map. The Mary Wyse property at 85 North Warsaw was changed from residential to commercial.
- Approved 1st Reading of 2017-11, Tax Levy Ordinance.
- Approved 1st Reading of Ordinance 2017-12 to amend Section 2-2-4 of the city code to change evaluation report from monthly to quarterly.
- Discussed Vicki Andrus-Splash Pad in city park, school property, or state park.
- Discussed Ripley Street survey/former NIC property.
- Set Beggars Night on Monday, October 30, 5:30-7:30 p.m.
- Approved Hancock County Sheriff's Reserve Donation of \$2,002 (\$1,606 for Nauvoo Pageant and \$396 for Grape Festival).
- Approved additional street closures during Pumpkin Walk, October 28, Partridge Street from Mulholland to Young (1:30-6:30) and first 200 from north of Mulholland on Barnett.
- Discussed Tourism Director's evaluations and sent to the Hotel/Motel Board for review.
- The Helpathon request from Warsaw High School will be in Nauvoo on October 26.
- The Hotel/Motel FY18 tax collections are currently behind of FY17 collections by \$14,864.86.
- The newly printed Nauvoo Experience Guide is being distributed.
- The Illinois Office of Tourism named 42 new makers to the Illinois Made Program. The Nauvoo Mill and Bakery is one of the 42 named Illinois Makers.
- The Economic Development Committee reports that Dollar General is considering a store in Nauvoo. The Committee recommended that the Chamber of Commerce interview the food establishments in Nauvoo to see if they can stay open morning, afternoon, and evening, and look for a tavern that serves food. Karen Ihrig is working on grants for senior housing.


Heroes & Heroines Family Concert
