Capital Campaign Committee Update

The fourteen members of Nauvoo's Community Center Capital Campaign Committee (NCCCCC) continue to collect and refine information and forms necessary for the campaign's success.

In separate meetings in April, the committee met with Nauvoo-area resident Greta Wetzel, Executive Director of Memorial Hospital Foundation and West Point, Iowa's, Dennis and Kate Menke. All are actively involved capital campaign leaders. The Menkes are presently chairing the campaign for West Point's \$6 million Holy Trinity Elementary School project and have been involved in their town's successful library project, which raised over a million. The committee is, indeed, flattening the learning curve on the fine points of capital campaigning.

In 2011, Nauvoo's civic needs were evaluated based on interviews and analysis with various representatives of city organizations that might benefit from a facility that would accommodate more than just a new library. The, then, "Public Space Committee"—the Committee's name when it was first formed almost ten years ago, had former committee member Roger Black summarize this information into a comprehensive document that, eventually, formed the basis for the present plan for the proposed Nauvoo Community Center. The Committee has invited Roger to return to Nauvoo to assist the reorganized committee (NCCCCC) in planning and budgeting. Roger and wife Kathy served a Public Relations mission in Nauvoo in 2010-2011. His professional background includes



Director of Management Services for Salt Lake City and coordinating with local governments for the 2002 Olympics. Roger and wife Kathy have accepted the committee's invitation to assist with the Capital Campaign. They plan to return to Nauvoo and have agreed to work with the committee for a year. The Blacks anticipate returning to Nauvoo by late May or early June.

Joseph Smith Historic Site's Centennial Year



In May of 1918, 100 years ago, the first caretakers were sent to Nauvoo to prepare what is today the Joseph Smith Historic Site for visitors. Mr. and Mrs. J.W. Layton (Ida) were sent at the request of The Reorganized Latter Day Saints' (now Community of Christ) President Frederick M. Smith to restore the homes of Joseph and Emma Smith, maintain the grounds, and give tours to visitors passing through the site. A written account of their experiences were written by Ida indicating how they enjoyed talking with visitors and friends, and entertaining the missionaries and traveling elders sometimes for days.

The Joseph Smith Historic Site is currently open Tuesday-Saturday 10 a.m.- 4 p.m. through May 20 and May 21 October Town having at the Visitor Contract 265

Monday-Saturday 9 a.m.-5 p.m. Sunday 1-5p.m. May 21-October. Tours begin at the Visitor Center at 865 Water Street.

- Approved 2018 Nauvoo Pageant requests and street closures: the Pageant will perform nightly shows every evening except Sunday beginning Monday, July 9, and ending Saturday, August 4. White Street between Partridge and Main, Partridge Street between White and Mulholland, and Hyde Street between Hotchkiss and White will be closed from 6-11 p.m.
- Approved appointment of Patty Haigh to the Library Board.
- Approved appointment of Lee Ourth and Alan Moberly to the Public Spaces Committee.
- Approved changing the name of the Public Spaces Committee to the Nauvoo Community Center Capital Campaign Committee.



According to Lynn Niewohner, Director of Western Illinois Area on Aging, residents of Illinois, Iowa, and Missouri will have new Medicare cards sent in a plain, white envelope during the month of June, 2018. By April 2019, all Medicare beneficiaries will have their new cards. (DO NOT get rid of your old card until you get the new one. And, make sure you take the new one with you to doctor or hospital visits.)

BE AWARE! Scammers are coming, too. The new Medicare card number is like a social security number. DON'T give it out casually. Remember, Medicare will NEVER call you to gather personal information and will NEVER ask you to pay for the new card. The park was the site of the Sauk and Fox settlement, "Quashquema," until 1824, when Captain James White purchased their claim.
